Lecturer's Reflection 07/03/2024

As we look forward to celebrating Independence Day tomorrow, I'd like us to stop and really think about what our forefathers put in the Declaration of Independence and where we stand as Catholics on life. I'll quote the Declaration and then make three points concerning it.

Quote: We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator, with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.

First point. We would all agree the intent of "Creator" is a reference to God. But sadly, there are those who would argue they don't believe in a god. Fair enough. I'll give them the latitude and say, a life created scientifically, biologically, comes from the parents, so mom and dad are the "creator" for that child. But what's interesting is what follows.

Point two: It states, "the individual is endowed by their creator (i.e. God or mom and dad) with certain unalienable rights." Let's look at these last two words: Unalienable – US legal says, Unalienable right refers to rights that cannot be surrendered, sold or transferred to someone else, especially a natural right. Webster defines it as, "Incapable of being alienated, surrendered or transferred." "Unable to be taken away." according to Cambridge. And from Google's Dictionary.com. "Something that can't be transferred to someone else, taken away or denied." So we see in both cases, God or parent, the creator, whoever that is, has given something, endowed if you will, to another person that cannot be denied, taken away or transferred. It becomes that person's right. In this case a Right to life. So what is a right.

Point three: The United Nations defines human rights as "Entitlements inherent to all human beings, regardless of race, sex, nationality, ethnicity, language, religion, or any other status." Point being a fetus falls into other status. We aren't talking about a family pet, we are talking about a human being, a person. Science indisputably proves humans beget humans. So any offspring from a human is human and that human has inherent entitlements, rights. So let's consider how a right is defined. Well, Webster defines it as "Something to which one has a just claim or something that one may properly claim as due." "Those things that one is morally or legally entitled to do or have," according to Collins. And again from Google's Dictionary.com—"Moral or legal entitlements to have or obtain." So the next time someone tells you abortion is a right. Or choosing to eliminate a life, under the guise of reproductive rights is a just act, point out that no matter how you slice it, by definition, those self-interests or compromises do not, nor do they ever override what is guaranteed by the creator of that life. Whether it's God or the parent. Once life has been created, the creator, however defined, has automatically guaranteed that person the right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. Those guarantees come with an unchangeable set of laws, both natural and legal. Happy 4th.
